As such, she will be identifying needed enhancements to Agristability and Agrinsurnace; advancing the development of a hedging program; and modernizing the Canadian Agriculture Loans Act program. In addition, Phillis will seek to improve the profitability of Canada's hog producers by working to secure improved market access to export markets through new or expanding existing trade agreements.

The CPC serves as the national voice for hog producers in Canada.
