




5 NATIONAL FINDINGS


01	Production – Slaughter is down -2.8% YTD.	
02	Sows – Sow slaughter and exports are up +3.85% YTD.	
03	Live trade – Cash iso-weans averaged \$48.01/piglet this week. Feeder pigs averaged \$71.78/pig.	
04 Prices – Prices have softened, falling -11% in the weeks.	Prices – Prices have softened, falling -11% in the last 4 weeks.	
05	Profitability – Ontario Farrow-to-Finish margins for August are \$58.09/hog, down -23% from its highest returns in June.





FEDERAL SLAUGHTER CAPACITY UTILIZATION








SOW/BOAR EXPORTS & CANADIAN SLAUGHTER



US IMPORTS OF ISOWEANS BY **PORT OF ENTRY**














CASH FEEDER PIGS 40 LBS


WEEKLY HOG PRICE ONTARIO

FARROW-TO-FINISH MARGINS ONTARIO



Market pig value (\$/pig) is based on 101% of the monthly average Ontario base formula price, the monthly average dressed weight (kg), an index of 110 and a premium of \$2.00 per hog.

The **feed costs** are estimated using corn, soybean meal and premix. Monthly corn value is based on the average of the daily Huron FOB Farm and the Western Ontario Feed corn prices. Monthly soybean meal value is based on the average daily Hamilton soybean meal prices plus \$20/ tonne for trucking and handling.
