



# CANADIAN SWINE BIOSECURITY INITIATIVE

The Canadian Pork Council will review the National Swine Biosecurity Standard, first developed in 2010 by the Canadian Swine Health Board and encourage improved biosecurity measures on-farm.

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## OBJECTIVES OF THE UPDATED CANADIAN BIOSECURITY STANDARDS

### Protect the health of the Canadian swine herd

- Improved animal health and welfare outcomes
- Reduced antimicrobial use

### Business Continuity

- Enable rapid zoning to prevent disease spread
- Facilitate the establishment of compartments

### Continuous Improvement

- Provide commercial producers with a simple self-assessment tool
- Provide a training tool for small-scale producers

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The revised National Swine Biosecurity Standard will be the foundation on which benchmarking tools and biosecurity training resources are to be developed.



## BIOSECURITY COMMITTEE

A group of producers, veterinarians, provincial coordinators and consultants, led by CPC staff Audrey Cameron and CPC Veterinarian Consultant Egan Brockhoff.

## OBJECTIVES

- Update the National Swine Biosecurity Standard (2010).
- Develop ways to encourage producers to continuously improve biosecurity measures on-farm such as benchmarking tools

- Updated National Swine Biosecurity Standard
- Voluntary Benchmarking Tools**
  - On-farm benchmarking
  - Feed Mill benchmarking
  - Truck wash audit
